Here are the best elements to a research paper: 1 The Introduction. Here's where you present the background and context for the rest of your article. Craft a strong opening sentence that will engage the reader. Just because you're writing an academic research paper doesn't mean you have to be dry and boring.

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Prepare a short (4-6 pages) research paper that identifies several key issues related to how parents divorce affects children. Incorporate at least 8-10 scholarly, credible, and current references to support your ideas, drawing primarily from government and community agencies as well as scholarly journals and books.

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A research proposal is a concise summary of your research paper. It creates the general idea of your research by highlighting the questions and issues you are going to address in your paper. For writing it, demonstrate the uniqueness of your research paper. This is the first draft that demonstrates your skills to conduct research.

Gather your research. Your professor or teacher will give you guidelines on what kind of research is permissible for the paper. A good place to start can be an academic journal, because journal authors often cite several other sources that you can use. Short research papers may require as many sources as longer pieces.

In short, a thesis is the main idea, a central point of your research paper. The arguments you provide in your paper should be based on this central idea, that is why it is so important.
